b. Additions or Changes to the Draft Meeting Agenda

There were no additions or changes to the agenda.

Approval of November 16, 2022 Meeting Summary

The motion was made by Livonia, to approve the November 16, 2022 Full ARC meeting summary. The motion was seconded by Rochester Hills and passed unanimously.

d. Salt Watch Program

Sally Petrella with FOTR shared the screen for her presentation on the Salt Watch Program. Some highlights were:

- Rouge River Bug Hunt Scores 2001-2023
- Stonefly 2002-2023
- Road salt history and characteristics

- Road salt downsides
- Road salt and watershed health
- Road salt limits
- Salt watch chloride readings winters 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023
- Reducing salt use

Karen Mondora with Farmington Hills explained their city's procedures in reducing the amount of salt with using brine, anti-icing with pre-wet salt. Karen invited FOTR and others to visit their facilities to learn additional information. Karen agrees their needs to be more outreach with school districts, private parking lots on reducing the amount of salt. Annette DeMaria asked if there was a capital investment to switch over to brine. Karen responded no and the savings was invested into the equipment. Karen also mentioned the APWA does a lot of training at the annual snow conference. Sally was interested in the number of communities who already use brine and many communities raised their hands.

2. Executive Director Report

a. Executive Director's 2022 Annual Report

Annette DeMaria shared her screen for the presentation of the 2022 Executive Director's Report summarizing the 2022 activities. The 2022 Executive Director's Report can also be found on the ARC's website. Some highlights were:

- Grant funded projects (ongoing and completed)
- Advocacy/Partnerships
- Recognition of awards (Tamarack Creek, Johnson Creek Fish Hatchery and Certificate of Excellence Michigan Natural Resources Commission)
- MS4 permits
- IDEP Initiatives: Investigations and Training
- Water Quality Sampling Results
- Public Education Initiatives
- 2022 PIE materials distributed

Annette asked if there were any questions, there were none.

b. MS4 Update

Annette DeMaria informed the Full ARC that 30 permit reapplications were submitted on time by April 1st. In addition, all of the collaborative plans for IDEP, TMDL, PEP and PPP were updated and submitted to EGLE prior to the deadline.

c. Investigational Sampling Update

Annette reviewed the status of the agreements that are in progress with the 3 sanitary sewer districts (Western Townships Utilities Authority-WTUA, Evergreen-Farmington Sanitary Disposal System-EFSDS and Rouge Valley Sanitary Disposal System-RVSDS). WTUA's board has approved the scope of work, pending approval of the other two sewer districts. At OCWRC's request (on behalf of EFSDS), the ARC provided a limited scope of work for 2023 to be in line with their annual budget. OCWRC recently provided approval of the proposal on behalf of EFSDS. RVSDS is still considering how the work can be contracted.

e. Grant Status Report

John O'Meara reported there is a grant update document in this meetings packet. John report summarized as follows:

- The ARC has approximately 11 direct funded grant projects that total over \$18,000,000.
- The ARC is also partnered with 2 other grants for around \$3,000.000.
- John reminded the members that the ARC is 501(c)(3) and also a governmental agency under state law which allows them to get direct funding to the ARC without competing.
- John mentioned there are some outstanding grant applications out: USFS Reducing Runoff for additional trees and three with the EPA's environmental justice initiative (working with WC Parks, City of Inkster, and Westland).

f. Call for Projects

John O'Meara reminded the members of the form that is available on the ARC's website.

g. Great Lakes Restoration Celebration at The Henry Ford 9/22/23

Chris O'Meara informed the committee that the ARC will be sponsoring the 4th Annual Great Lakes Restoration Celebration at The Henry Ford on September 22, 2023. The Henry Ford, SEMCOG and ECT are providing in-kind services. This summit will showcase the restoration projects in Southeast Michigan. Attendees will be local, state and federal elected officials. Local watershed groups will be celebrated along with the work they are doing with GLRI funding. There is no cost to the ARC for the event. The ARC is asking ERB to sponsor the event, as well.

3. Treasurers/Finance Committee Report

a. A/R, A/P and Profit/Loss Reports

Rebecca Runkel reviewed the A/R, A/P and profit/loss reports.

b. 2023 Member Dues

Rebecca Runkel stated the first round of invoices went out previously and the next round of invoices will go out in May 2023.

c. Ratify E-mail Vote

Rebecca Runkel reported on the following email votes to ratify by the Full ARC:

• 12/13/22: 23 yay 0 nay – Officer slate 2023-2024 of Doug Moore-Chair, Charles Markus-Vice Chair, Rebecca Runkel-Treasurer

The motion was made by Oakland County, to approve the ratification email vote of 12/13/22. The motion was seconded by Birmingham and passed unanimously.

d. 2023 Budget Amendment

John O'Meara reviewed the 2023 budget amendment adding the new EGLE AOC PAC Support grant for RRAC facilitation and monitoring under account SPAC12. The grant award is for \$154,500 over three years with no match required. ARC staff activities include facilitation, web site development, Rouge dashboard updates. FOTR will provide monitoring and business activities like EJ work. This contract is pending contract signature approval by EGLE.

The motion was made by Farmington Hills, to approve the 2023 Budget Amendment adding SPAC12 for AOC PAC Support Grant for the RRAC activities as presented by the Finance Committee. The motion was seconded by Rochester Hills and passed unanimously.

e. 2023 ECT and FOTR Work Orders

John O'Meara stated the two Work Orders for ECT and FOTR are pending contract signature approval from EGLE. ECT's work order 2023-2 is in the amount of \$54,500 which covers activities for the AOC PAC Support grant SPAC12. The Friends of the Rouge work order is for \$100,000 and includes activities related to the AOC PAC Support grant SPAC12.

The motion was made by Oakland County to approve the ECT Work Order 2023-2 and FOTR Work Order 2023-2, upon agreement signature, which adds the activities related to SPAC 12 RRAC Support Grant as presented by the Finance Committee. The motion was seconded by Farmington Hills and passed unanimously.

f. 2024 Member Dues

Rebecca Runkel stated that the 2024 dues will have a 2% increase. The information is in the agenda packet.

4. Standing Committee Reports

a. Organization Committee

Trisha Gabriel reported that there have been no activities under the Organization Committee.

b. PIE Committee

Jacy Garrison reported the following PIE activities that are planned in 2023:

- 1 article and ad graphic
- 1 static display
- 1 workday (Canton) and rain barrel sale (Livonia) at an ARC community GI site (FOTR)
- Volunteer monitoring (FOTR)
- Final report/map for Ours to Protect watershed road signs. Chris O'Meara stated she is currently still waiting on some information from communities and to get her the information if you have not already. The signs need to be installed by communities by June 1 to meet permit requirements.

Jacy Garrison reviewed the <u>results of the 2022 public survey on water quality changes in the Rouge River</u> and informed the committee that it is available on the ARC's website. The overall results of the 2022 survey suggest that the ARC's focus should continue to educate the public on watershed and stormwater concepts and what they mean, encouraging activities the public can do to help protect the Rouge River, and promoting restoration projects and the continued improvement of water quality in the Rouge River.

Jacy Garrison reminded the group that the ARC banners are being reserved through the ARC website including the ARC General Information banner, ARC Proper Chemical Use and Disposal banner, and the new ARC Best Management Practices (BMPs) for Businesses in the Rouge banner.

c. Technical Committee

Karen Mondora reported that the collaborative IDEP and TMDL plans have been approved by the ARC and submitted to EGLE. These reports are available on the ARC's website. MS4 permit reapplications have been completed and submitted. IDEP investigations will be ongoing this year. The TMDL metric summary report is almost complete and will be available for ARC member review soon.

5. Report from Cooperating Partners

Friends of the Rouge

Sally Petrella reported:

- 2022 annual report is available on the website
- Annual meeting will be held virtually on April 13th
- Volunteer appreciation in person event on June 22nd
- New website development and hopes to be launched in fall 2023
- Upcoming events:
 - o April is Earth month: Woody debris workday in Inkster and others
 - o May is Rouge Rescue month
- FOTR store is open
- Marie McCormick joined John O'Meara and Patrick Judd in Washington DC
- Current projects with RRAC and ARC: AOC PAC Support grant to support fish and bug
 monitoring; continuing planting 13,000 trees in the lower rouge; FOTR is partnering with the
 AOC PAC Support grant to the ARC and their involvement with the pending ARC grant
 application for environmental justice projects in Inkster and Venoy-Dorsey.
- FOTR is working on a full watershed report card funded through the Erb Family Foundation
- Frog and toad surveys: there are 200 people surveying 200 blocks
- Erb Family Foundation is funding FOTR \$212,000 for cross programmatic outreach and education, asset mapping, community engagement while doing watershed wide assessment and working with AOC adjacent communities, trying to develop local stewards for the long term of the project after completion.

- FOTR received \$360,000 National Fish and Wildlife Federation grant making green stormwater infrastructure work for public spaces in southeast Michigan. With that, FOTR will be installing a rain garden in Redford and a natural playground at an elementary school in Dearborn.
- Invasive species work
- FOTR has a \$60,000 request into DNR fish and habitat partnership to do culvert inventories in the lower rouge. This will help prioritize where projects that could be done to improve the river/fish.
- FOTR is growing with 4 new hires and now currently have 19 employees

Great Lakes Water Authority

Dan Gold reported GLWA is working with USGS to install monitoring equipment locations in the Detroit, Clinton and Rouge River watersheds. There are eight phase 1 sites and are currently on the USGS website. They are close to finalizing phase 2. GLWA is currently working on the regional E.coli monitoring program for GIS mapping. GLWA is also working on a couple pilot procedure projects. One with OHM for in situ monitoring equipment. GLWA is working with Wayne State University on perivial source tracking. Dan stated if there were any questions he can be reached at outreach@glwater.org.

6. Report from Counties

Oakland County

Jacy Garrison reported that Oakland County is updating their website so if members have links to pages they may need to be updated. Jacy also reported that their Regional Stormwater Summit will be held on October 13, 2023 at Lawrence Tech University.

7. Report from EGLE

Kathleen Sexton reported there were 30 Rouge MS4 reapplications received, and they are expected to be expedited with permit numbers staying the same. EGLE acknowledged receipt of the collaborative plans and they are in process of reviewing and approving. EGLE is currently doing permit evaluations and are in the field doing audits.

Jack with EGLE reported they have \$600,000 available to support general organizational administration as well as conservation and educational activities. Applications are due on May 17.
