Dear Mr. Ballnik:

The Michigan Office of the Great Lakes (OGL) approve the attached Habitat Restoration Project List titled, *Rouge River Area of Concern Projects Needed to Remove the Habitat BUIs*, dated February 25, 2016. It was compiled by the Rouge River Advisory Council (RRAC) Habitat Committee with the assistance of our Rouge River Area of Concern (AOC) Coordinator, Ms. Jennifer Tewkesbury.

The Habitat Restoration Project List includes detailed individual habitat restoration projects that must be completed to demonstrate restoration success as required by the *Guidance for Delisting Michigan's Great Lakes Areas of Concern* for the Loss of Fish and Wildlife Habitat and Degradation of Fish and Wildlife Populations Beneficial Use Impairments (BUIs). The Habitat Restoration Project List also includes the Concrete Channel Modification/Enhancement Project which is currently being overseen by the Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District for project feasibility, design, and implementation. Therefore, the OGL expects that the successful implementation of these habitat projects, in conjunction with the remediation of contaminated sediments within the Lower Rouge River Main Stem and Old Channel, will lead to the removal of the Loss of Fish and Wildlife Habitat and the Degradation of Fish and Wildlife Populations BUIs.

The OGL's approval is based on ensuring inclusion of all components and does not bind the state or federal programs to any new monitoring activities. Additionally, since the AOC program is non-regulatory and has no independent authority to require actions, local developed criteria do not bind any local, state, or federal program to specific remedial actions or protection actions.

We appreciate the time and effort on the part of the Rouge River Advisory Council to develop the Habitat Restoration Project List, and we look forward to working with you to support remedial actions and removal of BUIs in the Rouge River AOC.

The RRAC membership appreciates the time, assistance and effort you have provided in preparing this submission. Should you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact us.


